The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety, Division of Juvenile Justice in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the ~~fiscal year 2020-21~~ **fiscal year 2020-21** beginning on, or after **July 1, 2020**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

Proposed program services should target the following Risk Factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

Youth under age 12 continues to be brought to the attention of juvenile court for having a first delinquent offense alleged in a complaint; Substance use; Behavioral problems at school; Lacks positive peer relationships; Associates with others involved in delinquent activity; runaway from home or placement.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain: 73% of youth are rejected by positive peers, have some/regular associations with other delinquent peers and are in need of prosocial skill development. 4% of the youth are associated with a gang member.

Individual Domain: 32% of youth are in need of substance abuse assessment/treatment services. 24% of youth are victims of abuse. 31% of youth are in need of more mental health assessment services and 41% are currently involved in the mental health system and receiving treatment.

Family Domain: 29% of youth are experiencing domestic discord or violence in the home. Parents of 56% of youth are in need of parent skill building/ family support services due to reporting marginal to inadequate skills to supervise youth. 53% of youths' families have family members with criminal histories or they are currently under the supervision of court or gang involved.

School Domain: 78% of youth are exhibiting moderate to serious behavioral problems in school; 17% of youth are functioning below grade level.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
