The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety, Division of Juvenile Justice in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state **fiscal year 2022-23** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2022**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

Proposed program services should target the following Risk Factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

Youth under age 12 are involved with juvenile court for having a first delinquent offense alleged in a complaint; Prior felonies or misdemeanors; Substance use; Moderate to serious behavioral problems at school; Youth lack positive peer relationships; Associates with others involved in delinquent activity; Youth is a gang member or associate with a gang member; runaway from home or placement.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments and YASI for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain: Youth are rejected by positive peers. Youth have some/regular associations with other delinquent peers and gang members, and are in need of prosocial skill development.

Individual Domain: Youth are victims of abuse/neglect. Youth are in need of substance abuse assessment/treatment services, and in need of more mental health assessment services.

Family Domain: Youth are exposed to domestic discord or violence in the home. Parents of youth are in need of parent skill building/family support services due to reporting marginal to inadequate skills to supervise youth. Family members of youth have criminal histories or they are currently under the supervision of court or gang involved.

School Domain: Youth are exhibiting moderate to serious behavioral problems in school related to school suspensions, unexcused absences, and an increased drop out rate. Youth are functioning below grade level.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
