## First Rabies Case of 2016 Confirmed in Alamance County

**BURLINGTON** – The North Carolina State Laboratory of Public Health in Raleigh has confirmed Alamance County's first rabies case for the year.

On July 18th, a fox was killed by an unvaccinated dog when the fox entered the dog's fence. This occurred on Preacher Roberson Road in Snow Camp. Alamance County Sheriff's Department Animal Control was called to pick up the fox, and the fox's head was sent to the State Laboratory of Public Health for rabies testing. On July 20th, the State Lab confirmed that the fox has rabies. The dog was euthanized on July  $20^{th}$ .

If you live in this area and have outside pets, you should examine pets for any wounds that may have come from contact with this fox and notify animal control or the health department's Environmental Health office at (336) 570-6367 if you have questions or concerns.

## If you are bitten by **any** animal:

- Wash the wound with soap and running water for ten (10) minutes and seek medical attention immediately.
- Write down the location of the animal and a description of the animal to provide to animal control. If the animal is someone's pet, also get the owner's name and address. Give this information to animal control or the health department.
- Do not try to catch any wild or stray animal

"It is North Carolina law that cats and dogs be vaccinated against rabies," reminds Environmental Health Director, Carl Carroll. "Rabies vaccination protects not only your pet, but also helps to protect you and your family". There is a Rabies Clinic scheduled for August 6<sup>th</sup> by Burlington Animal Services, located at 221 Stone Quarry Road in Haw River from 9am until 11am. Cost of the vaccine is \$5.00.
