Hager, Roger G.M.

Lance Corporal, U.S. Marines

died July 8, 2009 in Afghanistan when the Humvee in which he was riding was hit by an improvised explosive device. Lance Corporal Hager was the son of Mrs. Elaine Farren and the stepson of Donald Farren. He was 20 years old and a February 2008 graduate of Western Alamance High School. He is also survived by an older brother, Jeremy S. Hager, also a Marine, and by a sister Faith Strang, who serves in the U.S. Army reserve. Burial at Gibsonville City Cemetery

Rainey, Pruitt

Corporal, U.S. Army

died July 13, 2008 during a surprise attack on a small U.S. military base in northeast Afghanistan near the Pakistan border. The surprise assault resulted in the death of nine NATO International Security Assistance Force soldiers who were assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 503rd Infantry Regt., 173rd Airborne Brigade Combat Team. Before being deployed, Cpl. Rainey lived with his grandmother Linda Kearney in Haw River. He was a 2004 graduate of Graham High School. Burial at Bethlehem Christian Church Cemetery in Altamahaw.

Lam, Alan Dinn

Lance Corporal, U.S. Marines
