General



- Alamance County Health Department
- Alamance County Community Services Agency, Inc. is committed to moving people from poverty to economic self-sufficiency through the provision of technical, informational, educational, and support services such as these.
- Women's Resource Center: Empower women to improve and enrich their lives. We support them through life transitions to help them achieve stability, self-sufficiency, sustainability, and success.
- The Alamance County Children's Dental Health Center: Offers cleaning, fluoride treatment, infant oral care, tooth brushing/flossing instruction, nutrition counseling, sealants, fillings, crowns, extractions and emergency treatment for children 0-21 years of age.
- Residential Treatment Services of Alamance: 24-hour services to both men and women with mental illness, and/or recovering alcoholics and addicts.

Transportation



- Alamance County Transportation Authority (ACTA) is a Public Authority established July 1, 2002 by the Alamance County Board of Commissioners. The Authority is to provide transportation for the elderly, disabled, and general public in Alamance County.
- Piedmont Area Regional Transit (PART): There's a Greensboro to Chapel Hill route and schedule. See the Alamance County Park & Ride locations to both the Triad and Triangle.
- Alamance LINK Transit: Serving Burlington, Gibsonville, Alamance County Offices and Alamance Community College.

Abuse



- Family Justice Center of Alamance County: Provides one-stop services for victims of family violence and elder abuse. Under one roof, professionals from different disciplines work together to provide consolidated and coordinated safety, legal, and social aid to individuals and families in need.

- CrossRoads: Has been serving child and adult survivors of sexual assault, abuse, and human trafficking through confidential counseling, advocacy, child medical treatment, education, and community awareness since 1976.

Housing



- Alamance Department of Social Services: Promote self-sufficiency for individuals and families and prevent the abuse, neglect, and exploitation of vulnerable citizens.
- Allied Churches of Alamance County: To prevent and end homelessness and food insecurity through providing direct service and leadership in collaborative community efforts.
- Burlington Housing Authority: Safe, affordable housing for families, seniors and disabled individuals in Burlington, North Carolina. Utilizing federally-funded housing programs, in conjunction with non-profit social programs, BHA offers support services and life skills training to prepare residents to transition from subsidized to non-subsidized housing.
- Graham Housing Authority: Quality and safe rental housing for eligible low-income families, the elderly, and persons with disabilities. In total there are 170 units for public housing, which include 20 elderly units.
